Stallions at Irish Pony Club Activities

Stallions may be ridden at Irish Pony Club activities but with some restrictions and only under the following conditions.

- Permission must be sought in advance on each occasion from either the DC, the
 Area Rep or the Person in Charge. On arrival the DC, the Instructor and the
 Person in Charge must be in full agreement that the rider and stallion
 combination is safe to take part in the proposed activity without interference to
 others. If there is doubt about the presence of the stallion causing any
 discomfort or any safety issue amongst other members then he must be asked
 to leave straight away.
- The member should be 15 years or more, have passed the 'C' test and be familiar with the stallion, riding him on a regular basis.
- A stallion master carrying a stallion shank must be in attendance throughout any
 activity. The stallion must have 'stallion discs' on both sides of his bridle. When
 not being ridden he must be stabled or in a trailer and supervised by the stallion
 master continuously.
- Stallions are not permitted at the 'C+' or 'B' Tests, on sponsored rides or on any group ride outs.

As the Pony Club is principally a training organisation, with many young and inexperienced members, extreme caution and common sense must be exercised when deciding whether or not to allow stallions to be part of any Pony Club activity.
